Hey Viola! is a musical exploration of civil and women's rights trailblazer Viola Desmond. From the 1917 Halifax explosion to the civil rights struggles of the 1950s, this extraordinary journey through Viola's life looks at the impact she had on changing Canadian history. Born in 1914 Halifax, Viola Desmond was a businesswoman of Black Nova Scotian descent who challenged racial segregation by refusing to leave the whites-only area of the Roseland Theatre in 1946. That moment spurred a civil rights movement in Canada that posthumously led to Desmond becoming the face of the Canadian \$10 bill.



The indelible testimonial of the late Ottawa resident, David Shentow, a WWII immigrant and Holocaust survivor, lies at the heart of the film's remarkable journey that begins in 1942 on Le Chemin des juifs, a forgotten road in Northern France. Filmed on location in France, Belgium, Canada and the UK, Le Chemin des Juifs is a valuable and vivid document reliving one of the darkest periods of history. Yet, it is a story which inspires us all as a celebration of the power of the human spirit. The event will include a unique live performance of the original film score, composed by renowned film composers Patrick Savage and Holeg Spies followed by a discussion led by the film's director.

Inspired by his roots, the innovative fusion artist Tunde Jegede bridges African and European musical traditions in his work. A cellist and a composer, he takes listeners on a journey to the heart of Malian griot culture. With re-imagined cinematic imagery of ancient Africa, it is a meditative musical experience. The Cree hoop-dancer and musician Jessica McMann joins him alongside violinist Daniel Bhattacharya for a Fusion of musical styles.

CHUCK COPENACE: GLOBAL GROOVES

Chuck Copenace is an Ojibway jazz musician based out of Winnipeg MB. He shares his story of recovery, spiritual awakening and how traditional ceremony changed his musical outlook. He is one of a very elite group of indigenous musicians who honor their traditional melodies by incorporating them into his work. He has performed across Canada, parts of the USA and in Central America, and featured on numerous television appearances. Chuck has extensive festival experience that includes performances at Winnipeg, Montreal, Saskatchewan, Vancouver and Victoria's jazz festivals.
